<u>SECTION 1 - HFAH DEPARTMENT GENERAL RULES</u> (NOTE: You do not have to be a Franklin County resident to participate in HFAH. Entries from other counties are welcome.)

- 1. Entry Forms:
 - a. Online entries go to www.fairentry.com.
 - b. Mail-in entry form is in Section 22, HFAH Forms.
 - c. For questions regarding the online or mail-in form, please contact Sharla House, sharla.house@gmail.com, or 614-354-5686.
 - d. The mail-in form must be mailed to:

- e. Both Online and Mail-in forms must be received, or post marked by July 6, 2023.
- 2. General Entry Rules All exhibitors must purchase <u>one</u> of the following to be eligible to enter HFAH classes:
 - a. Exhibitor Pass: (\$20.00) This includes two single day admission passes.

- b. Season pass: (\$40.00). This includes entry during entire fair.
- c. <u>FCAS membership pass</u>: (\$45.00). To purchase a membership pass, you must be 18 years or older and a resident of Franklin County. This pass includes voting privileges for FCAS Board Members. The membership fee must be purchased in person at the Fair Board Office. Photo ID required.
- d. Advisor Pass: The advisor pass must be approved through the Extension Office or Scouting Advisor.
- e. <u>Ir. Fair Pass</u>: The jr. fair pass must be approved by the Extension Office or Scouting Advisor.

3. Class Entry Fee:

- a. <u>Adult entries</u> Each individual entry has an entry fee of \$3.00 for all "Home, Fine Arts & Horticultural" categories, unless otherwise specified in the section rules. Entry fees are non-refundable.
- b. Youth 2nd grade and under may enter "Section 4, Art-Youth 2nd grade & under" at no fee.
- c. <u>Youth/Junior exhibitors</u> enrolled in a 4-H, BSA or Girl Scout project may enter adult classes under adult rules and entry fees but are not required to purchase an entry pass (rule 2).
- d. Youth not involved in the Junior Fair are required to pay for an entry pass (rule 2).

4. Entry Tag Process:

- a. Entry tags and fair passes may be picked up at:
 - i. The Fair Office on Thursday, July 13 from 3 to 6pm.
 - ii. The Edwards Building on Friday & Saturday, July 14 & 15 from 3 to 6pm.
 - iii. The Edwards Building on Monday, July 17 through July 23 from 9 am 9 pm.
- b. Any participant that has not picked up their Entry Tags prior to the opening of the fair must purchase a ticket at a gate to enter the fairgrounds.
- c. Entry tags must be securely attached to the entry.
- d. There is a claim check at the bottom of each entry tag. This will be returned to the participant during drop off. No entry will be released without this claim check.
- 5. All entries must be made by or be the work of the exhibitor.
- 6. There is a maximum of three (3) entries per Class.
- 7. Entries may not be a previous Franklin County Fair premium winner.
- 8. The Directors reserve the right to reject or return all or part of any entry. Soiled or damaged entries will not be judged.
- 9. The Directors may move an entry to a different class if it is entered in the wrong class.
- 10. The drop off, pick up and judging location for all entries in the Home, Fine Art and Horticulture Classes is the Edwards building.
- 11. No entries will be accepted after designated drop off time. (See Section Rules.)
- 12. The decision of the judge(s) is final. Any exhibitor who interferes with judging in any way will forfeit premiums from all HFAH entries.
- 13. Not all ribbons/premiums may be awarded in each class if the entries are not of expected quality.
- 14. All precautions will be taken to protect exhibits from loss or damage. However, the Directors and the Franklin County Agricultural Society are not liable for any loss or damage to exhibits. Insurance is the responsibility of the exhibitor.
- 15. Section Rules Check rules under each section for additional requirements for each Section/class. This includes drop off and pick-up dates, judging dates, and specific rules that apply to each section.
- 16. Any entry not picked up becomes the property of the Franklin County Fair Board.
- 17. All entrants may participate in the <u>Youth Fundraising Challenge</u> by listing your favorite 4-H Club, Girl Scout or BSA Troop when making your entry. Please see <u>Section 2</u> for details

<u>Eligibility</u>: Any elected official within Franklin County is eligible to participate in this contest, including those elected to any Franklin County public office (i.e., county, city, town, village, or twp) and school board members.

SECTION ENTRY RULES:

- 1. All rules in "Section 1 HFAH General Rules" must be met prior to completing the following Section rules.
- 2. Entries must be made by the Official listed as exhibitor.
- 3. Each official may only submit one entry.
- 4. The entry form is found at "fcfair.org" under Open Class Events.
- 5. If there are more than 20 entries in the class, we reserve the right to split the class into cookie types.
- 6. Required Food Safety Guidelines: Only products that are safely kept at room temperature for several hours may be entered. If any ingredient is not stable after opening without constant cool temperature, it cannot be used in a recipe without being cooked. All eggs must be cooked. Cream cheese and whipped cream will not be permitted if not cooked within the recipe. If the cookie is to be iced, the icing must not include more than 2 tablespoons of milk or heavy cream.
- 7. Judging: Judging activities will occur in the Edwards Building.
 - a. Participants must bring one dozen cookies to judging, displayed on a disposable container (no glass plates will be accepted) and covered with clear plastic wrap.

- b. A typed recipe must be submitted with the cookies the night of Judging. The recipe must include all ingredients and instructions needed for preparation of the cookies and meet all requirements listed in Rule 6.
- c. The entry may be delivered to judging by a representative of the official. However, the official <u>must</u> be present on stage during the auction if their entry has been selected as one of the top entries to be auctioned.
- d. Judging is closed to the public.
- 8. <u>Auction</u>: The auction will be a part of the Junior Fair Creative Baking Auction and will take place in the Entertainment Tent.
 - a. Only the top entries selected at judging will be auctioned.
 - b. An entire recipe of cookies must be brought to Auction and must be covered with clear wrap.
 - Cookies brought to the auction must be fresh, well presented and completely baked. No burnt entries will be accepted.
 - d. Cookies for the auction may be displayed in a basket or decorated item to attract buyers. The entire display becomes the property of the buyer.
 - e. Auction basket will be carried by the Elected Official at the auction.
 - f. No samples of items may be distributed during the live auction.
 - g. Officials are asked to promote their winning cookies by contacting potential buyers prior to the auction. It is suggested that officials work with their charity to help promotion of the auction.
 - h. All proceeds will be split 50/50 between the selected charity and the Franklin County Agricultural Society's (FCAS) Building Fund.

Rules:

- 1. After every round, the partnership will change. By alternating partners, this format provides an opportunity to make new friends or reunite with old pals. Teams play a total of 8 hands per round (game).
- 2. Players will be assigned a starting position when they arrive.
- 3. Each player will be responsible for keeping their own score. A score sheet will be given to each player.
- 4. The first dealer is determined by dealing the cards one at a time and face up until someone receives a jack. That player is the dealer and starts the game. At the end of each game, points are marked on the score sheet.
- 5. After the first deal, the deal is passed to the person on the left. Each person deals twice for a total of 8 hands. We will play Stick the Dealer, so the dealer has to say what is trump if everyone passes after the second round of determining trump.
- 6. The team that has the highest number of points at the end of eight hands will move up one table (i.e., From Table 1 to Table 2). The losing team stays at the same table, but one player will move over to the next seat. Thus, no one will have the same partner during the second game. If two players have played together in a prior round, they should not play together a second time.
- 7. Each player keeps his own score. At the end of the tournament, all scores are totaled up. The player with the most points wins. Payout will go to the top four scores.
- 8. When a team is euchred, each member will pay a quarter. At the end of the tournament, the money will be given to the person with the most loaners.

- 9. If we don't have players to fill tables in multiples of 4, we will have players sit out some games. If a player must sit out, they will receive 7 points for that game (deal 8 times). We will assign sit outs from the highest number table and will place a card at the places that players will sit out. When a player re-enters the game, they will re-enter at Table 1.
- 10. During play, the only question you can ask is what trump is.
