Girl Scouts of Ohio's Heartland Council is a volunteer organization and a member of the United Way Fund. The Girl Scout Program offers a wide range of activities in the arts, the home, and the out-of-doors. It is one program with five age levels, each in harmony with the needs and interest of the girls at that age. Girls of all races, creeds, nationalities, economic, and geographic backgrounds who are willing to accept the promise and law are welcome to join. In Girl Scouting, the emphasis of the program is on service. The promise, "On my honor, I will try: to serve God and my country, to help people at all times, and to live by the Girl Scout Law", is an essential part of a Girl Scout's life.

General Rules and Information for Girl Scouts

PLEASE READ ALL RULES AND STUDY CLASSIFICATIONS CAREFULLY. ANY ENTRY NOT CLASSIFIED CORRECTLY WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

- **1.Eligibility:** Registration is open to all currently registered Girl Scouts who belong to a troop that primarily resides within Franklin County. Each girl may only enter her current age level (at time of last fall's Girl Scout registration): Daisies, Brownies, Junior, Cadette's, Senior or Ambassadors.
- **2.Leader/Advisor Check:** It is recommended to have all entries and work checked by the Girl Scout leader so that all exhibits are in accordance with the rules.

3. Exhibitor Work:

- a) Only project made during the current year and level may be exhibited.
- b) Graded school project may be entered, but the grade and teacher's comments must be removed or covered.

- c) Exhibits may not exceed 22"x28"x22", with the exception of sewing projects that can be folded. If possible please place entry within zippered style bag
- d) Exhibits may no be smaller than 2"x4"x2" unless mounted or boxed at least that size.
- e) Please do not enter extremely fragile and valuable items.
- f) All artwork must be the girl's original work not kits.
- g) All artwork must be matted or framed.
- h) Creative Writing entries must be bound in a folder.
- i) Group projects shall consist of the work of multiple girls in one program level. The exhibit may be one article on which at least two girls have worked on, or it may be a minimum of two with a maximum of six articles made by girls in a troop project. The group project must follow the size requirements in rule 3-C Group projects will be non-competitive, for display purposes only. A troop may have one entry per age level. This entry would fulfill the "Advocacy & Engagement" requirement of visibilty of troop in community for the Super Troop award. Entries should be made under 1 girls name only
- **4. Number of Classes Entered:** Each individual exhibitor may enter one exhibit per individual class in as many interest areas as she is eligible. Please register only for classes that you intend to exhibit.
- **5. Entry Requirement:** All entries will be done online, due by current year's deadline. Enteries will be made at https:\\franklincountyfairOH.fairentry.com
- **6. Entry Check-In:** Exhibitors are to bring their entries to the Franklin County Fairgrounds, in Hilliard. Please have each entry within a separate Zippered style plastic bag, including all components of entry. Entry tag stickers will be attached to all entries at this time.
- **7. Entry Tags and Claim Tags:** Entry tags must be securely fastened to the individual exhibit. A 3"x5" or 4"x6" index card must also be attached to each item entered with the following information: section #, class #, service unit, program level, scouts age, materials used, why you completed the item and what you learned. Items without this information will not be judged.
- **8. Exhibit Protection:** Every effort will be made to protect the exhibits from loss or damage. However, neither the Fair Management nor the Girl Scouts Girl Scouts of the Ohio Heartland's Council organization, including its volunteers will be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits. Please inclose item within zippered style plastic bag.
- **9. Disqualification:** The Department's Advisor in Charge and Scouting Committee reserve the right to disqualify any article that is soiled, shows hard wear, or that does not comply with the rules and regulations of the Franklin County Junior Fair Division and the Girl Scouts of Ohio's Heartland Council organization. Damaged items will not be judged.
- **10. Release Time:** Entries may be taken home at close of fair on Sunday at 5PM. Pick up on Sunday will last from 5PM to 9PM from GS booth in Ganyard Building and be walk-in only, no cars will be allowed on the grounds. All other articles will be released after the close of fair by

contacting gscountyfair@yahoo.com The Fair Management will not be responsible for any article left on the grounds

- **11. Judging:** Judges will use the following criteria in evaluating exhibits: knowledge and experience gained by the girl as described on the index card, originality, creativity, craftsmanship, attractive appearance, high quality effort, neatness, and exhibits durable construction.
- **12. Awards:** Participation ribbons will be awarded to Daisy and Brownie exhibitors. Juniors, Cadettes, Seniors and Ambassadors will receive blue, red or white merit ribbons based on the judging results. Entries will be graded-not rated. Blue merit ribbon entries will be eligible for Best of Show honors. Best of Shows will be selected in each of the following levels: Junior, Cadette, Senior/Ambassador. Each age level is divided into 6 Sections. Age class sections must have 3 or more enteries for a Best of Show to be presented. Group projects will be for exhibition only.
- **13. Junior Fair Events:** Any Girl Scout member, up to 18 years of age as of January 1 of the current year, is also eligible to participate in Junior Fair Department Special events, or Youth Events if they have entered in at least one Dept. Girl Scout class. Pre-entry is required online at https:\\franklincountyfairOH.fairentry.com and/or additional forms as listed in the Special Event rules.
- **14. Enforcement of Rules:** All rules will be enforced by the Junior Fair Department Advisors and Committee, working with the Girl Scout section of the Franklin County Junior Fair. All rules must be followed NO EXCEPTIONS.
